## MONDAY 20 NOV

**Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue  
“I didn’t know the fire service did that”**

**1-2:30pm.**

A regional online webinar hosted by Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue Service presenting what they do to protect and support adults in our community, and how agencies can refer into them. It'll cover volunteering opportunities, multi agency working, domestic abuse referrals for support and advice and its educational programmes.

## Changing Lives

**An introduction to Changing Lives' Netreach Programme  
3-4pm.**

This session will cover how online harms such as intimate image abuse, sexually coerced extortion and online exploitation impacts people 16+. It looks at how to manage disclosures of online harms, what external support is available and how online platforms are used to sell sexual services and content. It will cover how Changing Lives uses its Netreach Model to extend its support .

**TUESDAY 21 NOV**

## **Bridging Gaps in Transitional Safeguarding Cultures.**

**9:30-11am.**

In this session on transitional safeguarding, Steven Baguley, contributor of 'Bridging the Gap' will guide us through his report findings. He will emphasize the critical collaboration between adult and children's services and provide insights to support practitioners to embed the recently released transitional safeguarding protocol into practice.

## **Families First – why adopting a 'Think Family' approach works!**

Through interactive discussions and practical exercises, participants will develop the skills to assess family needs holistically, enhance communication across services and feel equipped to implement 'Think Family' principles.

## **Safeguarding Carers: Empowerment and Support** **10-11am.**

This online session by North Tyneside Carers Centre, we will explore the pivotal role of carers, a responsibility that affects an estimated 6.6 million individuals throughout the UK. It will highlight the importance of conducting timely and comprehensive assessments for carers and address potential safeguarding situations they may encounter.

As practitioners, you will gain valuable insights into effectively supporting carers with safeguarding situations.

## **Unlocking Insights: Learning from Safeguarding reviews** **2-5pm.**



In this session, jointly facilitated by North Tyneside Council, Northumbria Health Foundation Trust, the Integrated Care Board and Cumbria, Northumberland Tyne and Wear NHS Foundation Trust, we will delve into the insights gleaned from recent Safeguarding Adult and Domestic Homicide reviews at the local, regional and national levels. Its imperative for practitioners to stay informed about the recommendations arising from these reviews. We will discuss the valuable lessons learned and identify cross-cutting themes to enhance our safeguarding practices.
